Most of the History course requirements can be taken in any order with the exception that HIST 290 must be taken prior to HIST 300 with a grade of C or better.

Required Upper-Division Courses

The Department offers several upper-division AHIS, EHIS, & WHIS courses each semester.

Prerequisites: The majority of the upper-division history courses have prerequisites of Sophomore Standing (SoS) or 3 s.h. of any 100-level HIST course. There are a few exceptions and students should always refer to the College Catalog Course Descriptions for course prerequisites.

Required Seminars

HIST 290 & 300 are required seminar courses and are offered every Fall and Spring semester.

Prerequisites for these courses:

HIST 290—Junior Standing (JrS) and 12 s.h. of Upper-Division (200-300 level) history courses.

HIST 300—HIST 290 with a grade of C of better.
