The 4<sup>th</sup> annual Faculty Research Show is scheduled for **Wednesday, 10 March 2004**, in the Morris Conference Center. The Faculty Research Show highlights the excellent and diverse research conducted by College at Oneonta faculty. Last year's Show featured 40 presentations, representing 23 different departments, in a variety of formats (posters; PowerPoint, video or slide presentations; hands-on exhibits; book displays; and a limited number of scheduled talks).

Plan now to be a part of the Show. A *Call to Participants* is being distributed. You can get a head start in responding to the *Call* by preparing the following information to submit to the Grants Development Office (koenigkl@oneonta.edu) by the deadline of **9 January 2004**.

- Name, title and department of presenter
- Title of project/presentation and co-authors (if applicable)
- An abstract of 500 words or less
- Requested presentation format (GDO staff will make every effort to accommodate requests)

A program, including abstracts, will be produced and distributed at the Faculty Research Show. In addition, an informational brochure listing participants and titles of presentations will be available in advance of the Show for distribution to the campus community, including students.

The Faculty Research Show has proven to be a popular event, giving participants and attendants a chance to learn more about research activities on campus. Plan to attend and learn more about the work of your colleagues across the disciplines, and to share your own research endeavors.

The Faculty Research Show, scheduled for Wednesday, 10 March 2004, enhances scholarship and the academic atmosphere on campus.

The show is also an excellent opportunity to introduce students to research methodology and other elements of conducting and presenting academic research.

In the past three years, several faculty members have taken the opportunity to expose their classes to various research methods by requiring students to attend the Show, interview participating faculty about their research methods and results, and report their observations. This firsthand experience has given students a chance to examine research methods across various disciplines within the social and natural sciences, and humanities. The comparison has provided a valuable educational tool and makes for a lively Show.

FY 2004 (July 1, 2003 - June 30, 2004): 31% for regular employees

FY 2005 (July 1, 2004 – June 30, 2005): 35% for regular employees

FY 2006 (July 1, 2005 – June 30, 2006): 37.5% for regular employees

Undergraduate students: 3%

Graduate students: 8%, increasing 1% per subsequent year

Summer only employees: 16.5%, increasing .5% per subsequent year

SUNY employee (IFR): FY 2004: 35.94%

FY 2005: 40.31%
