## Make your brain work

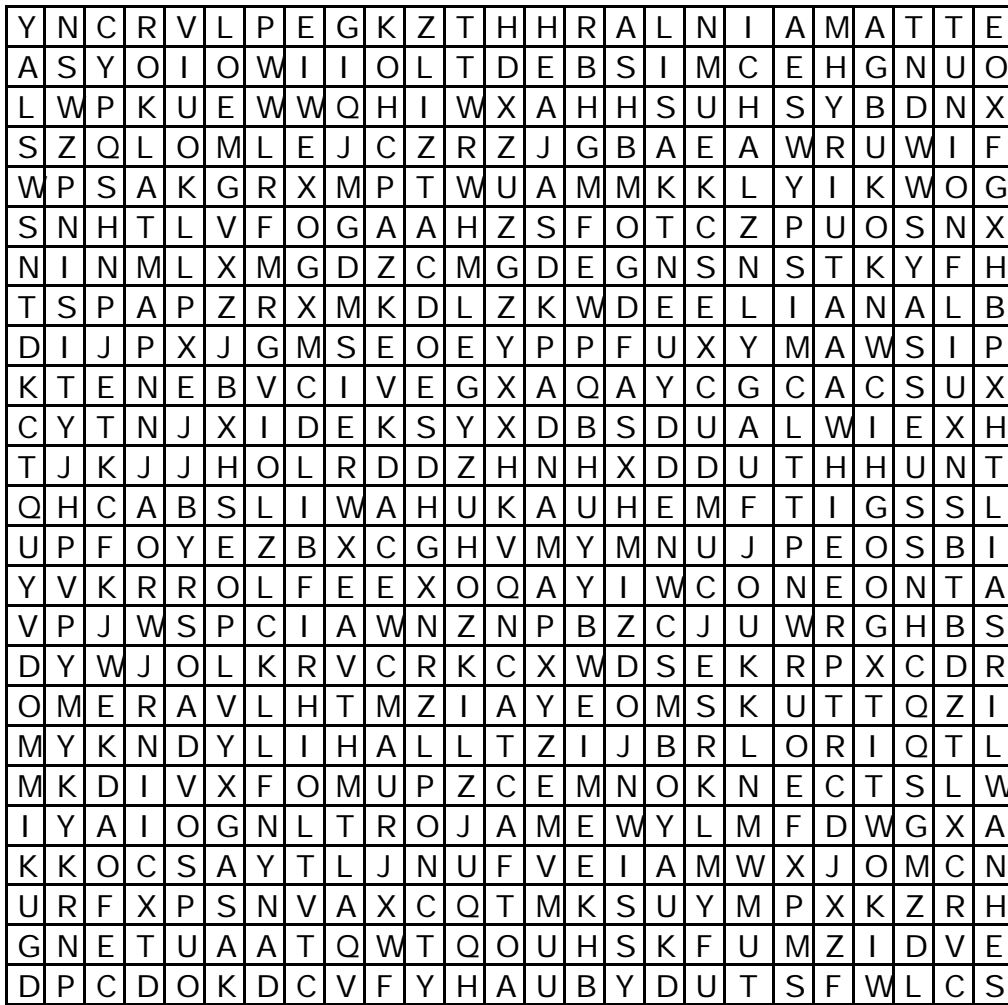


Sudoku: enter a digit from 1 through 9 in each cell, in such a way that:
