

They spoke about the Fashion and Textiles program and the Student Fashion Society and answered questions from attendees. The Fashion and Textiles majors "specialize in either fashion merchandising or fashion design. Fashion merchandising courses focus on marketing, merchandising, retail, promotions, economic analysis and fashion journalism. The Student Fashion Society is one of the biggest clubs at the college with an ambitious list of activities. They went to New York City for a tour of the FIT Museum. 


Dear Nancy Kleniewski,

50 years ago (Dec. 18, 1967) State University College at Oneonta is in line for construction projects totaling \$4,450,000 in 1968...The most costly project is a \$2,735,000 student union...Second in cost at \$1,113,000 is a new parking facility. This will be a three-story building with two levels underground. It will be erected across the main drive from the new fine arts building on the site of student practice fields.

50 years ago (Oct. 11, 1968) Dr. Charles Hunt, a past president of the State University College at Oneonta, urged Rotarians Thursday to listen to college students and not classify all students with those they read about in the newspapers...Dr. Hunt advocated giving college students more voice in college policy-making decisions, and praised both SUCO and Hartwick for giving students this chance. "These youngsters are more sophisticated and knowledgeable than any other generation—we cannot ignore them," he explained.

25 years ago (Oct. 23, 1993) A parent of a Hartwick College student recently got a letter in the mail informing him that his 18-year-old daughter had been charged with underage drinking...he called Oneonta Mayor **David Brenner** to thank him for sending the letter..."Our feeling is that if you're underage and doing what you shouldn't be doing, maybe your parents should know about it," Brenner said. "I just think parents don't have any idea that their children do these things."

Simonson, Mark. "Backtracking: In Our Times: Time and effort went into Yule greetings locally in 1972." The Daily Star. Dec. 18, 2017. p. 2. "James Mullen, then an art teacher at the State University College at Oneonta, had been years ahead of this trend. The Star said Mullen had 'drawn the print for his own Christmas cards for 13 of the last 17 years.' Alice Siegfried, who also makes her own cards, said 'It just wouldn't be Christmas without Mr. Mullen's cards.' Mrs. Siegfried is a former art student under Mullen...These weren't ordinary cards Mullen produced. Seventy-eight were donated and accepted by the Smithsonian Institution in Washington in the early 21st century. Elaine Downing, an assistant director of bibliographic services at SUNY Oneonta, also had some cards sent to the Smithsonian...Minnie Martin, also an art teacher

at SUNY Oneonta at the time, sent a silkscreened serialograph of a decorative tree ornament. 'She thinks the handmade cards give the feeling that you are giving a gift of yourself,' The Star said.
