COOPERSTOWN SYMPOSIUM ON BASEBALL & AMERICAN CULTURE – JUNE 3–5

The 21st annual Cooperstown Symposium on Baseball and American Culture will take place at the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum from Wednesday, June 3 – Friday, June 5. The symposium begins at 1PM on Wednesday with the keynote address by author Paul Dickson. At 9AM on Friday, Bill Simons, History, will present a seminar entitled *Baseball in the American Hinterlands: Barnstorming the Graphic Novel* in the Education Gallery. Panels will be featured on a wide range of baseball-related topics and there will be four plenary sessions during the event. University scholars and baseball researchers from across the country will also present more than 50 papers. SOCCER CAMP AT THE NATIONAL SOCCER HALL OF FAME: AUGUST 3–7, 2009

Under the direction of Oneonta State Head Coach **Iain Byrne**, his staff and players, the Men's Soccer Program will be conducting their 34th annual summer soccer camp at the National Soccer Hall of Fame in Oneonta. Two options are available to campers: the **Dragon Camp (9AM–4PM daily)** caters to youths from ages 6 to 14, while The **Elite Camp (9AM–3PM daily)** is geared towards high school players only. Both camps are open to boys and girls and run daily from Monday–Friday.

Campers can practice and develop their skills on the best soccer fields in the northeast while also enjoying the “indoor soccer stadium” and “interactive games” located in the Museum. PURCHASE OF BOTTLED WATER WITH STATE FUNDS

Governor Patterson has issued Executive Order no. 18 to prohibit the expenditure of State funds for the purchase of bottled water. Effective July 1, the College will no longer process payment of state funds for the purchase of bottled water, and any blanket orders for water for next year will not be renewed. There are occasions when the purchase of water may be necessary, and written justification request for such situations will be reviewed individually by the campus for possible exemption.
