## **BOMB THREAT PROCEDURE**

Bomb threats are a criminal offense which are perpetrated to ellicit fear. Therefore, several steps and items to remember are important.

- 1. Be calm and composed. Notify your supervisor and University Police as instructed. Talk to no one other than instructed by your supervisor/University Police Officer. Remember that the caller wants to get an emotional reaction. An over reaction will generate more "bomb scares."
- 2. The exact time you receive the call is an important part therefore, record the time.
- 3. Call the University Police as soon as possible after receiving a bomb threat.
- 4. Complete the bomb threat form as soon as possible. (Reverse)
  Specific information given during a call will be needed, to make a threat assessment.
  The exact words are needed so listen and record them as specific as possible. a.)
  When is the bomb going to explode? b.) Where is the bomb right now? c.) What kind of a bomb is it? d.) What does it look like? e.) Why did you place the bomb?
- 5. The decision to evacuate or not evacuate should be made by a University official in consultation with University Police. These officials will control the response at this time

Remember that the caller wants to get an emotional reaction. An over reaction will generate more "bomb scares."
